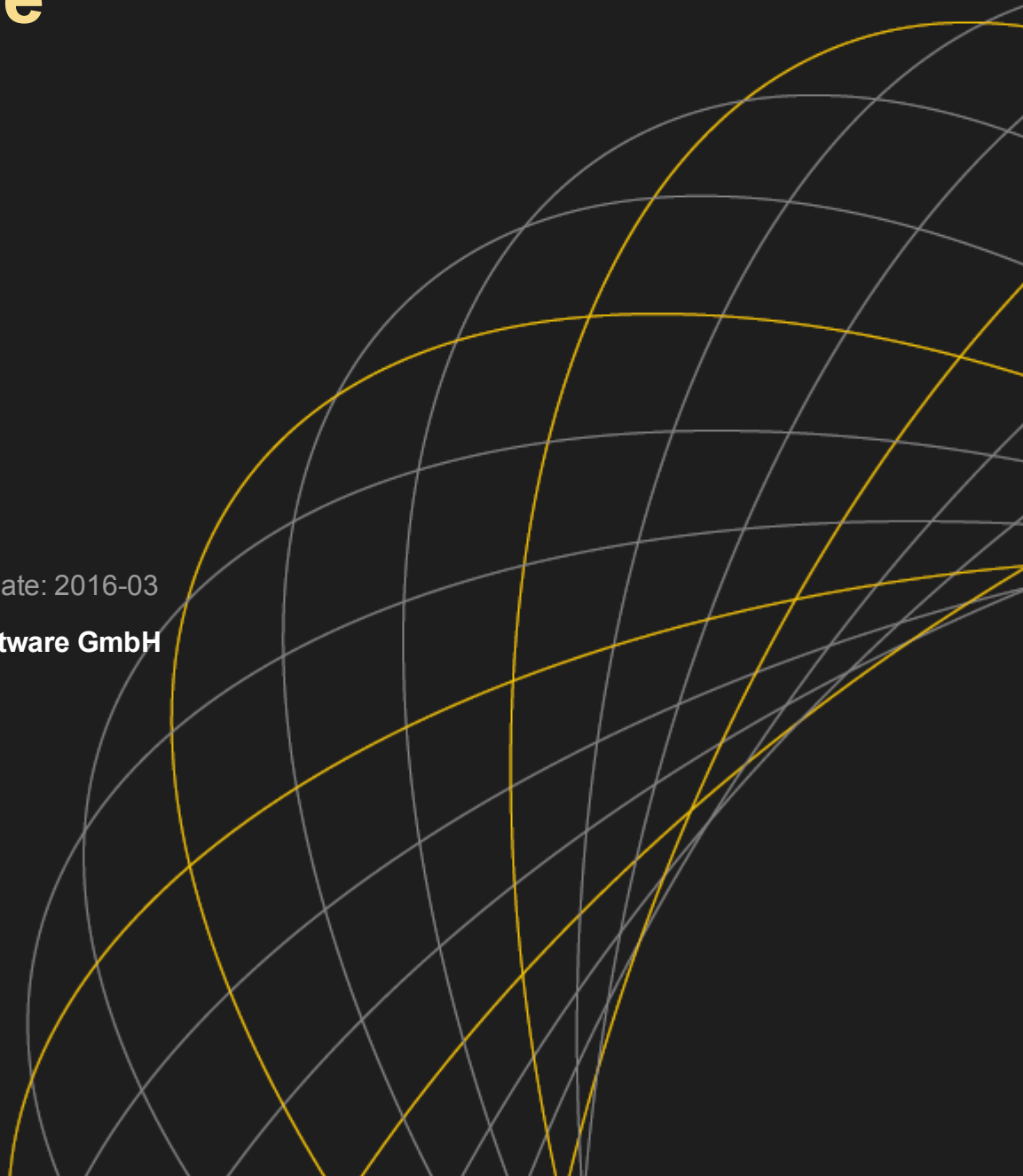

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## 2 About Plugin Manager

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This section describes the Plugin Manager and its main components.

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The Plugin Manager can be used to install, upgrade and remove Packs in order to extend the functionality of the ARA/ASO system.

### What are Plugins?

Plugins are software components that add a specific functionality to the Automation Engine system. They can be downloaded from the [Atomic Marketplace](#).

### What are Packs?

The currently supported Plugins are known as Packs. These Plugins consist of Automation Engine objects and Custom Types.

### What are Action Packs?

Action Packs are groups of Actions that are related to each other (for example, Windows File System Actions) and are always imported and exported as a single unit to an existing ARA/ASO client.

## 3.1 Importing Packs

 A wide range of predefined Packs aimed at incorporating different Actions into the release workflow can be downloaded from the [Automatic Marketplace](#).

### Steps to import a Pack

1. Go to the Administration perspective and click the **Packs** accordion tab on the sidebar.
2. Click **Install Pack**. The **Install Pack** window opens.
3. Click  and select the Pack you want to import.

 You can import newer versions of an already existing Pack. The system will automatically detect the former version of the Pack you want to import and prompt you to upgrade it.

## 3.2 Deleting Packs

### Steps to delete Action Packs

1. Go to the **Administration** perspective.
  2. Select the **Packs** accordion tab on the sidebar.
  3. Select the Pack you want to delete.
  4. Right-click to select **Remove** or click **Remove** on the toolbar.
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# 4 Installing and Configuring the Plugin Manager

The following prerequisites must be met before installing the Plugin Manager:

## Optional configuration settings

<p>The following snippet has been added to the <code>logback.xml</code> file in the config folder of the <code>webapps/ecc</code> directory on your Tomcat server in order to enable logging of the Plugin:</p> <pre>&lt;logger name="com.automic.apm" level="WARN" additivity="false"&gt;   &lt;appender-ref ref="LOGGER"/&gt; &lt;/logger&gt;</pre>	Enabling logging	<input type="checkbox"/>

## Installing the Plugin

The Plugin Manager is delivered as a `.zip` file which contains a `.jar` file.

To install the Plugin, the `.jar` file must be copied to the `autoinstall` folder within the `webapps/` directory of the Tomcat server running ECC.

If installed via the ONE Installer, this should be: `<installer-root>/External.Resources/apache-tomcat-x.x.xx/webapps/ecc/WEB-INF/autoinstall.`

After logout/login, the Plugin is available and ready to be used on the **Packs** accordion tab of the navigation sidebar, under the **Administration** perspective.



## Configuring the Plugin

Configuration is optional and can be done via the `manager.properties` file located in `/webapps/ecc/config/ecc-Plugins-Pluginmanager-<yourversion>` in your Tomcat installation.

### Troubleshooting Problems on Plugin Installation

If you experience issues when installing the Plugin, check to see whether this comes from one of the known issues:

Possible cause	Solution
The latest ECC version is not installed (11.2.1+)	Download the latest version from the <a href="#">Automatic Download Center</a>

-  The ECC log and messages can also provide useful information to identify the problem(s) preventing the Plugin from being installed.
-  The version of the Plugin can be retrieved from the log file or the About dialog of the ECC.

## 5 Updating the Plugin Manager

Updating can be performed by simply replacing the existing `.jar` file in the `autoinstall` folder within the `webapps/` directory of the Tomcat server running ECC with the new version. The configuration file will not be overwritten.

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## 6 Uninstalling the Plugin Manager

The Plugin Manager can be simply uninstalled by removing the corresponding `.jar` file from the `autoinstall` folder.
